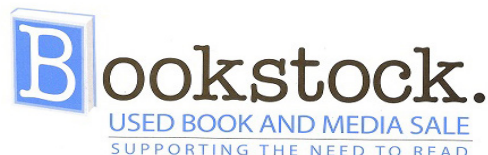

Tuesday, November 8, 2022. The midterm elections. Vote! That is our voice, and it needs to be loud and clear. We demand maintaining the integrity of our elections while keeping voting accessible, safe, and secure. Understanding the positions each candidate holds on voting rights, abortion justice, and gun violence prevention, will provide confidence in making informed decisions.

To that end, the Advocacy and Elections Committee is working on four major educational program:

- Join us for the Fall Focus webinar Crisis in America: Misinformation, Disinformation and Malinformation and Their Potential Effect On Our Midterm Elections with Barbara McQuade on September 20th at 7 p.m.

- We will again present Candidates Forums with candidates running for seats in the Michigan House and Michigan Senate

- We will educate our membership and community on the initiatives that address voting rights and reproductive freedom that may be on the November ballot.

- We will reach out to young people to assist them in registering to vote and to ask them to commit to casting their votes through our Let's Both Vote campaign, which won the NCJW 2022 Champions of Change Award.

In addition, we worked with Courts Matter Michigan to develop a new program, Courts Matter to Voting Rights, to educate young people (and others) on why their votes matter and how the right to vote relates to our judicial system.

## Courts Matter

**Courts Matter to Voting Rights** is a program to educate young people (and others) on the fundamental right to vote and how it relates to our judicial system, and also to encourage them to vote. The program is offered through an informative PowerPoint presentation with accompanying script, handouts, and facilitation guide. Section 1 of the materials focuses on voting and voting rights. Section 2 provides information about the federal courts and focuses on why they matter to voting rights and other issues.

We hope this will help everyone understand the role of voting as a means of voicing one's positions on issues and of determining court judges who will be making decisions on those same issues that they care about.

## NCJW Green Committee News

### *Let's All Reduce Our Use of Plastic for the Sake of Our Planet*

As you probably saw again this year, NCJW Green promoted the global Plastic Free July campaign. An e-blast was sent explaining the campaign, with tips for eliminating at least some plastic from your life.

Did you participate? If yes – GREAT! But even if you didn't try to cut back on your plastic use in July, there is good news: you can take these steps all year long! On our website you will find all the information that was sent out in July. We encourage you to take a look and try a few of the many ideas you will find there.

Plastic is a real problem for our planet. It does not ever completely decompose, so all plastic that has ever been created still exists in one form or another. Plastic has NOT been effectively recycled, in fact, only about 9% of plastic is actually recycled.

Plastic contains chemicals that leach out and are found in the blood and tissue of nearly all living creatures. Microplastics, small pieces of plastic debris resulting from the breakdown of plastic, are ingested by all of us. It has been estimated that each of us ingests about a credit card's worth of micro and nanoplastic each week.

The focus of the Green Committee for the next year is to work on facilitating the elimination of single-use plastic, starting with plastic bags and plastic bottles. You will hear more throughout the year about our efforts. Look for our e-blasts with information and ideas.

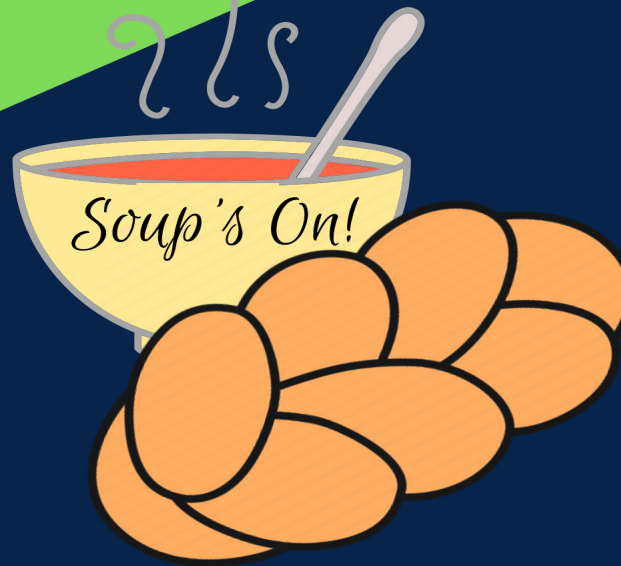
